How Our CEU's Work for In-Person Classes

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1. All persons successfully completing an in-person class will be awarded a Certificate showing the number of CEU hours awarded (usually 6), the course name, the date, and the name of the person completing the class.
2. One hour of the six hours awarded usually will be for completing *Legal / Legislative Update Related to the Practice of Code Enforcement*.
3. TDLR CEU's. TIDRC is authorized by TDLR to grant CEU credits to code officers and Registered Sanitarians. (See <https://www.tdlr.texas.gov/ceo/ceoce.htm>) For code enforcement officers and Registered Sanitarians wanting CEU credits recognized by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation, certificates carry this legend:

Code enforcement officers: This training is approved in accordance with Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation Rule 62.24 for code enforcement officer/code enforcement officer in training registration renewal in Texas. The curriculum consisted of five (5) hours of instruction in Professional, Supervisory, or Management Training Related to the Profession of Code Enforcement and one (1) hour in Legal / Legislative Update Related to the Profession of Code Enforcement for a total of six (6) hours.

Registered sanitarians: This training is approved for six (6) continuing education hours under Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation regulations.

Officers should retain their certificates and submit them to TDLR as directed by that agency.

4. TCOLE CEU's. For some classes, a local law enforcement academy may administer TCOLE hours. In most cases however, active peace officers wanting CEU credits recognized by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement should arrange for the recording of their hours with TCOLE by the Training Officer at their law enforcement agency. Officers wanting TCOLE credits are strongly advised to contact their departmental Training Officer well prior to their registration for the class to ascertain if their TO will need any additional documentation from TIDRC. Certificates provided to law enforcement as evidence of completion of an in-person class will carry this legend and should PROMPTLY be given to officer's Training Officer:

*Law Enforcement Officers: Please request your agency to review this class and, if approved for continuing education, report training hours to TCOLE as **Class 3880 – Environmental Law Enforcement**, for a total of six (6) hours.
